The Department of Family and Community Medicine, Division of Palliative Care at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre is recruiting a part-time palliative medicine physician for a locum position in our Palliative Care Unit (PCU).

Located in midtown Toronto, Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre (SHSC) is a fully affiliated hospital of the University of Toronto. The institution supports the Odette Cancer Centre, one of the largest cancer centers in the country, one of the largest ALS clinics in the country, and is the largest stroke and trauma center in Ontario.

The Division of Palliative Care at SHSC supports a 56 bed palliative care unit, a robust inpatient consult service, and ambulatory care clinics in cancer, heart failure, ALS, and dialysis, with plans to expand further.

The successful candidate should hold an MD or equivalent. The candidate should have completed post-graduate training in a recognized program in Palliative Medicine and must be eligible for medical licensure in the Province of Ontario.

The responsibilities of the successful candidate will include provision of excellent clinical care for 10 beds in the PCU and the individual must be a strong team player.

The anticipated start date is **January 3, 2022**, but may be flexible. The closing date for applications is October 22, 2021, although the position will remain open until filled.
